Will this be fun for adults?

YES!! If you enjoy learning about places in your own backyard, getting to know your olim "neighbors" whom you might not meet otherwise, enjoy nature and good company- you will have a blast!

Workshop leaders will relate to all ages and levels in their group. If you'd like a workshop geared towards adults & teens ONLY and enjoy crafts- choose wool spinning.

What aged kids is this appropriate for?

See workshop descriptions for ages 4 and up. Younger children can play in the playground, enjoy the children's corner (bubbles, coloring, etc.), and have plenty of outdoor space to roam around and explore.

Who needs a ticket and how do I choose which ones?

Workshop tickets- for anyone who will be attending a workshop. Choose according to the workshop descriptions below.

"Participant not attending a workshop"- for anyone ages 2 and up not participating in a workshop.

What language is this event in?

The farm's story will be told in 2 parallel groups, in Hebrew and English, with translation to Spanish and Russian.

The workshops will be conducted in Hebrew, with translation as needed with the help of participants.

Where will the bus stops for the free transportation be?

Kfar Eldad, Nokdim, Neve Daniel and Alon Shvut. We'll send pick-up locations and times closer to the event to those who register. The stops are contingent upon minimum registration. If we need to cancel a stop we'll try to find tremps for those who need.

Leadership & Herding Workshop

Ages
7+

Step into the role of a shepherd—one of the world's oldest professions!

Begin with an introduction to the farm and its activities, followed by a discussion about the important role sheep grazing plays in preserving the surrounding forest and protecting the land.

Work together with the flock, experiencing the responsibilities of a shepherd firsthand. Along the way we will strengthen teamwork, cooperation, leadership skills, strategic planning, and, of course, have plenty of fun.

Wear comfortable clothing and closed-toe shoes! This activity requires walking along the flock, and is not stroller-friendly. (Bring a baby-carrier if necessary.)

"Milky Way" Cheesemaking Workshop

Ages
4+

Experience the cheesemaking process from milking to the finished product through live demonstrations. See and feel the sheep from up close in the pen! Leave with a memorable hands-on experience, knowledge of how to make simple cheese at home, and, of course, taste the herb infused cheeses we help create.

This workshop is located near the playground and children's corner, which may be used by children who need a break during the workshop (under parental supervision).

Wool Spinning & Craft Workshop (Adults & Teens only)

Wool spinning is an ancient craft that was practiced as far back as the days of the Mishkan.

Learn how to clean raw, unprocessed sheep's wool and prepare it for use as a clean, workable fiber. Enjoy a hands-on experience, creating your own twisted yarn using traditional spinning and weaving techniques with a personal loom.

Can my child participate in a workshop on their own?

No, we cannot take responsibility for children under 18. However, you may designate another adult that knows the child to be responsible for them during the workshop (if the adult and child both agree).
